


February Homework Activities

Write 2 important things that you think the President should know or 2 things that you would like to tell President Obama.</p>

Have your child tell you about the people, places, and events in the book.</p>	<p>Activity 10 Make a list of 5 things you love about your family. Sound out the words on your own.</p>	<p>Activity 11 Ask your child about their day. Have them tell you at least 3 detailed things that happened at school.</p>	<p>Activity 12 Write these words in your notebook: can, mom, the, this, dad. Circle the first letter in each word. Underline the last letter in each word.</p>
